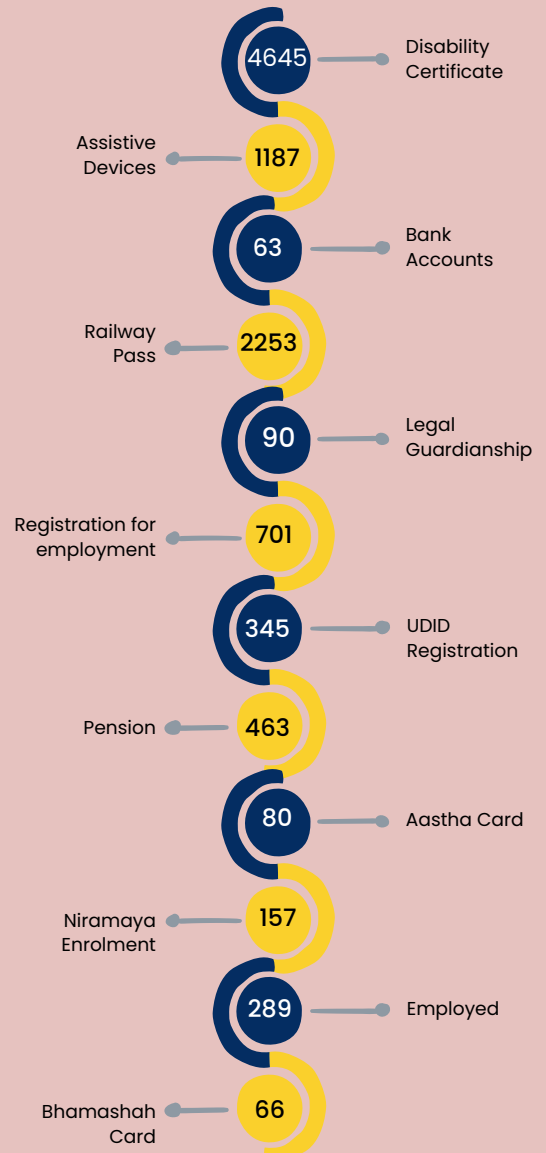

STORIES OF CHANGE

ALFIYA'S JOURNEY TO ----- *Improved Mobility and Socialization*



Alfiya, a 5-year-old girl residing in the rural area of Gegal near Police Chowki, faced significant challenges in her early development. Her father, Mohd. Atif, works as a laborer in an urban area, and she lives in a joint family setup with her mother, siblings, and grandparents.

Initially, Alfiya struggled with basic motor skills and communication. She couldn't sit on her own or speak monosyllabic words, and she relied on assistance for her daily needs. Social interaction held little interest for her. Recognizing her needs, the Community-Based Rehabilitation (CBR) program suggested admission to Minu Manovikas School, Chachiyawas, where she began her educational journey in July 2022.

Alfiya's path to improvement started with a focused physiotherapy program tailored to her needs. Over the course of four months, she underwent various interventions to address her specific challenges:

- Stretching exercises targeted her lower limbs, focusing on hamstrings, adductors, and tendo Achilles tendons.
- Upper limb strengthening exercises facilitated her ability to walk with walkers.
- Physio ball activities aimed at enhancing trunk control through pelvic tilting exercises.
- Bolster exercises aided in transitioning from sitting to standing and maintaining balance.
- Bilateral AFOS and knee gaiters were provided to improve her gait and posture.
- With consistent support and encouragement, she progressed from assisted walking with a walker to independent mobility.
- Emphasis was placed on long sitting and forward bend positions to further enhance her posture and mobility.

Presently, Alfiya has shown remarkable improvement. Her gait no longer exhibits scissoring, and she can maintain various sitting and standing positions independently. She walks with a walker, navigating her surroundings with increased confidence. Socially, she has blossomed, demonstrating improved communication skills and a willingness to interact and share with others.

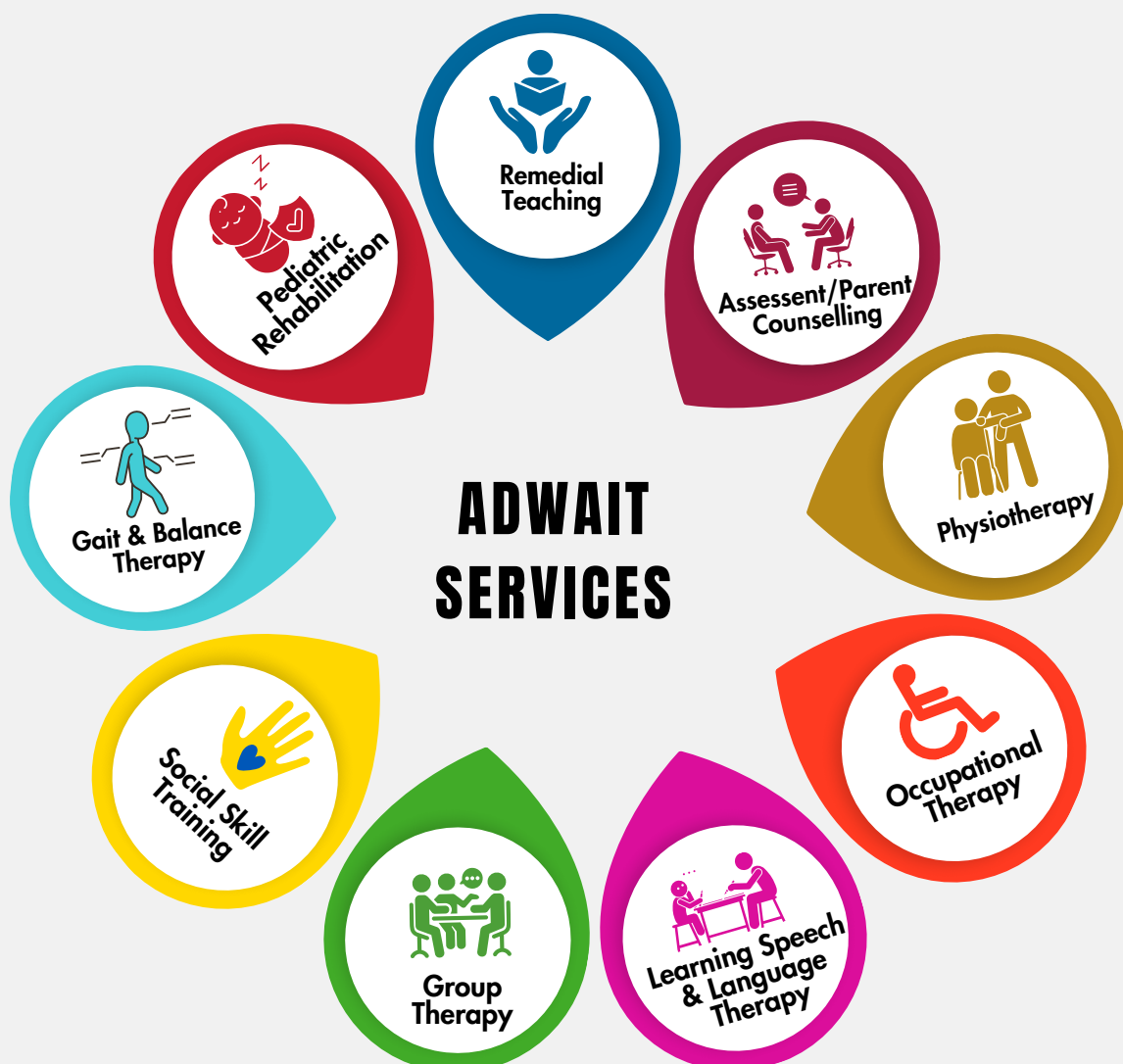
Moving forward, the focus remains on strengthening her lower limbs and enhancing her postural control to achieve complete self-dependence in mobility. Alfiya's journey highlights the transformative power of tailored interventions and dedicated support in overcoming developmental challenges.

COMMUNITY & MENTAL HEALTH

A critical aspect of RMKM's health initiatives is the focus on Early Intervention Services through Adwait Early Intervention Centre. Adwait addresses developmental impairments and disabilities in children aged 0 to 6 years, providing a comprehensive range of services including occupational therapy, speech and language therapy, and physiotherapy. This proactive approach ensures that children reach their fullest potential by offering timely support and maximizing cognitive development during these crucial early years. Adwait's commitment to early intervention contributes significantly to the well-being of children, fostering their independence and enhancing their quality of life through tailored, early-stage therapeutic interventions.



STORIES OF CHANGE

A JOURNEY OF HOPE

Farhan Khan's Transformation



When Farhan first arrived at the Adwait Centre for Excellence in September 2022, he was an 11-year-old boy with severe behavioral challenges, including shouting, running around, and stimming. His parents were overwhelmed and desperate for help, unable to manage his emotional outbursts and destructive behavior. Schools had turned him away due to his disruptive actions and communication issues, leading his parents to confine him to his room, limiting his social interactions.

An evaluation at the Adwait Centre revealed that Farhan had moderate autism and mild intellectual disability. His developmental milestones were delayed, with significant delays in speech. Farhan's behavior during the assessment, including vomiting, restlessness, and screaming, highlighted the need for a comprehensive intervention plan. The center recommended one-on-one sessions, focusing on Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA), a sensory diet, and speech therapy.

Farhan initially attended the center for brief periods, often accompanied by his mother. He resisted staying, causing disruptions, inducing vomiting, and soiling his clothes. However, the consistent efforts of therapists and special educators, combined with a sensory diet that included activities like wearing a weighted jacket, blowing bubbles, and engaging in tactile play, gradually helped him adjust to the environment.

Over two years, Farhan's progress was remarkable. He became calmer, could sit in class for longer periods, and reduced his shouting and other disruptive behaviors. He learned to eat independently, participate in classroom activities, and interact with his peers. At home, he began to follow instructions, perform household chores, and enjoy spending time with his family.

Farhan's parents, once feeling helpless, now saw hope for their son's future. Their consistent support, along with the dedication of the Adwait Centre staff, made Farhan's journey toward improvement possible. This transformation wouldn't have been possible without the generous support of Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal and Bajaj Finserv, who contributed to the resources and therapies that helped Farhan integrate into the school and community.

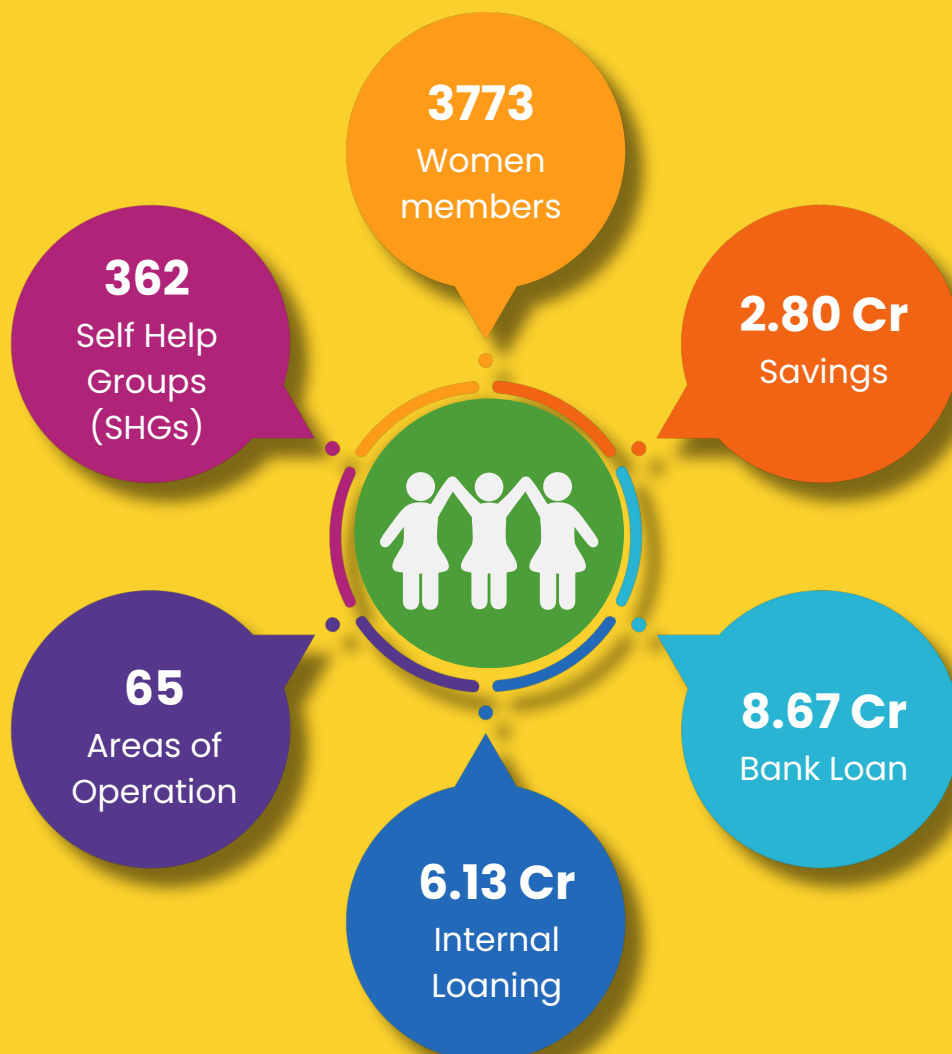

LIVELIHOOD PROMOTION & MICRO-FINANCE

RMKM's vocational training, skill development, and income generation programs play a vital role in promoting sustainable livelihoods and empowering socially deprived women. By offering microcredit and supporting self-help groups (SHGs), RMKM enables women to save and access small loans, overcoming challenges in obtaining credit from formal institutions. Additionally, RMKM's initiatives like "Gift a Goat" and loans for goat husbandry under Lakshmi Kalash Federation empower poor families with sustainable income opportunities.

TEEJA KANWAR'

Journey to financial independence



Teeja Kanwar is a resident of a village in Ajmer district. She is 55 years old and has been connected to the Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal for the past 10 years. Her family consists of her husband Chotu Singh, who has been disabled for the past 15-20 years and doesn't work. He spends 30-40 rupees daily on cigarettes and tea. Their eldest son occasionally works, but his income is minimal. Due to her Rajput heritage, Teeja Kanwar cannot work outside the home, resulting in a dire economic situation. Without any other source of income, the family relies on the support of the organization.

The organization connected Teeja Kanwar to a small self-help group, where she began to make small savings and took internal loans to meet her family's needs. Through this group, she received an 11,000-rupee loan, which she used to buy two goats, allowing her to support her family and repay the loan. As the goats reproduced, she raised and sold them during Eid, earning approximately 30,000 rupees. With this income, she bought a buffalo and paid off some of her old debts, gaining a sense of confidence.

Her second loan from the organization went towards farming expenses, such as buying fertilizers, weeding, and other agricultural work. The income from these activities helped her repay the loan and provide for her children's education. In 2018/19, the organization provided her with additional support by giving her a mature goat worth 7,000 rupees and a third loan, which she used to build two rooms in her home. Selling more goats during Eid allowed her to complete the construction.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, the organization supported her with food supplies worth approximately 10-12,000 rupees, helping her through a difficult time. Additionally, she received a 35,000-rupee loan through the "Rang De" program, which she used to buy another buffalo.

Teeja Kanwar now engages in both animal husbandry and agriculture, which provides enough income to support her family and repay her loans. Despite the lack of support from society and relatives, she is deeply grateful to the organization for its continuous support, which has empowered her to overcome difficult times. With this encouragement, she can now face challenges with confidence.

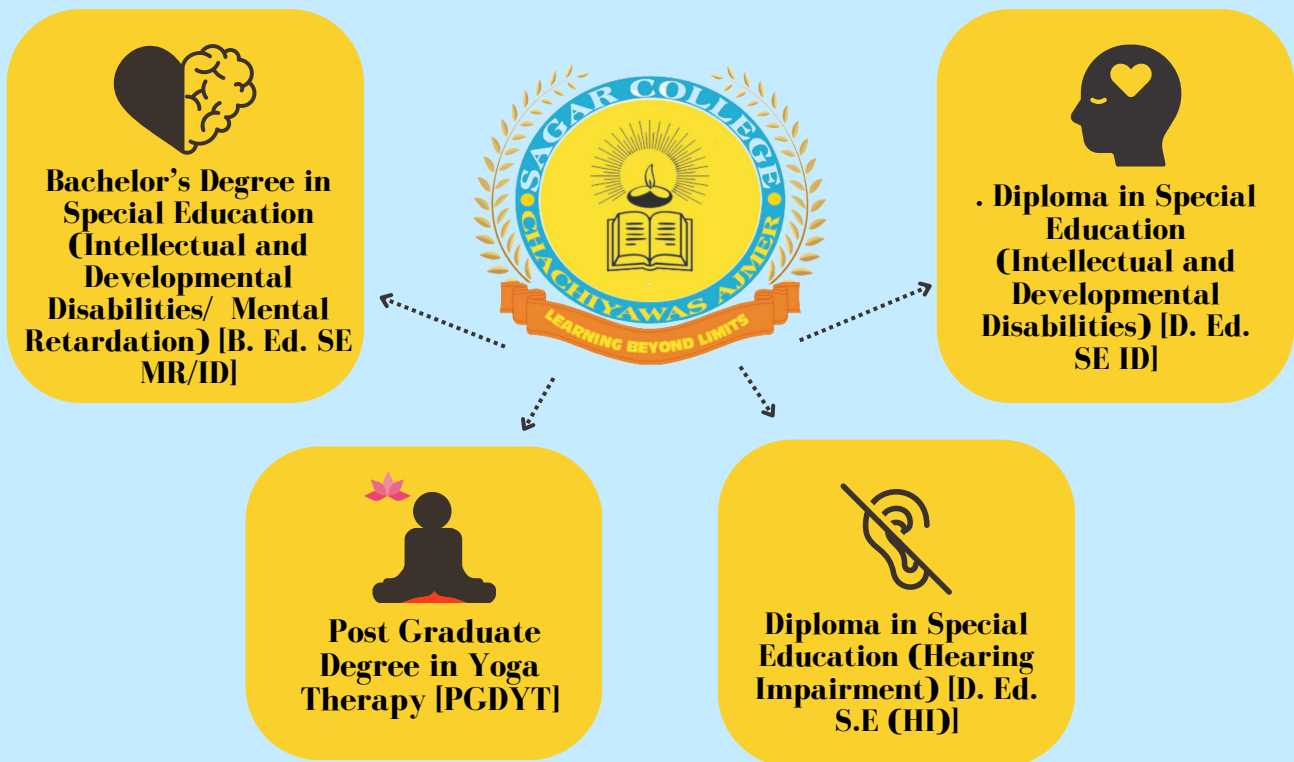

NEELIMA PRAJAPATI

Achieving Success Through Support

Neelima Prajapati, a 24-year-old from Harmada village in Ajmer district, had a dream to secure a government job, a vision she shared with her parents. Due to their challenging circumstances, her parents couldn't achieve this goal themselves, but they were determined to see their daughter fulfill it.



Neelima, who was always serious about her studies, had completed her bachelor's degree when her parents decided to enroll her in a B.Ed. program in special education at Sagar College, operated by Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal, in August 2020.

Initially, Neelima was hesitant about the additional expenses of the special education program and suggested pursuing a regular B.Ed. instead. However, after much persuasion and understanding the value of the opportunity, she agreed to pursue the course with dedication. Despite the disruptions caused by COVID-19, she completed her two-year diploma with good marks.

In September 2022, Neelima took the teacher recruitment exam, but it was canceled due to a paper leak. This setback was a significant disappointment for her and her family, but it didn't deter her. When the exam was rescheduled in February 2023, Neelima resumed her rigorous preparation. She joined a library, sought guidance from college faculty, and studied for 15 to 17 hours a day, despite health issues from the intense workload. Her mother, Mrs. Sajjan Prajapati, provided unwavering support, accompanying her to the library at 5 a.m. and staying with her until late at night, even while managing her own job.

Neelima's determination paid off. She secured the 28th rank in the state-level merit list for special education teachers and the first position in her district. On October 9, 2023, she joined as a Special Teacher Level 2 in the Rajasthan government. Grateful for her success, Neelima credits her family, RMKM, and Sagar College for their support and acknowledges that without special education, achieving a government job would have been much more challenging.

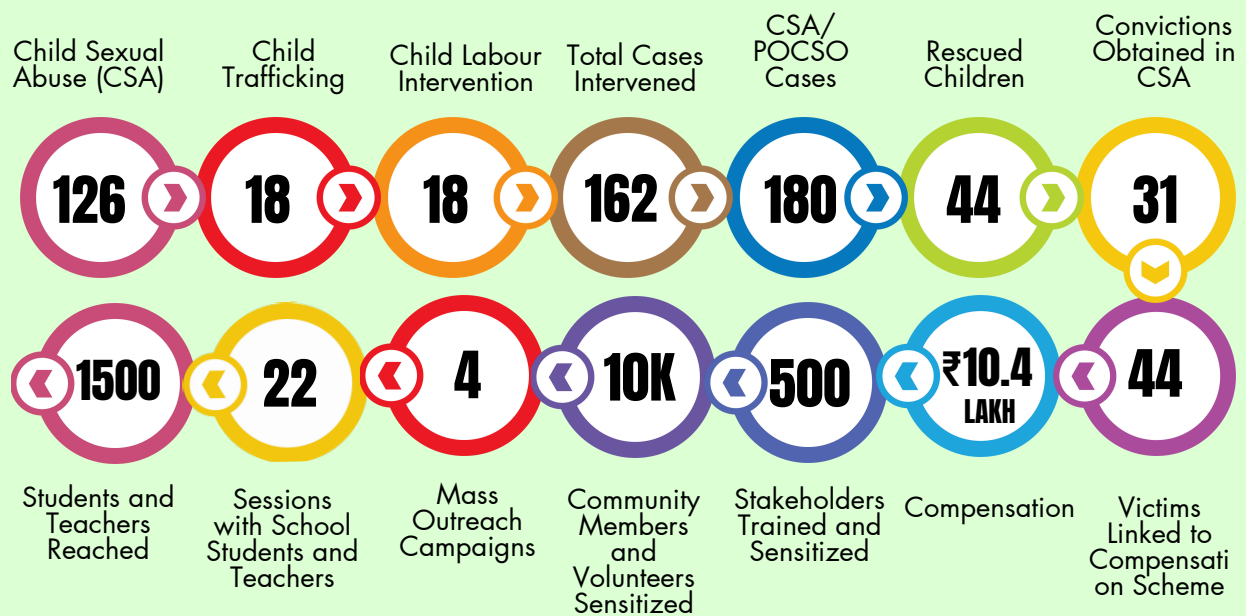

CHILD RIGHTS & CHILD PROTECTION

Access to Justice

Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal (RMKM) partnered with Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation (KSCF) to champion Access to Justice in Rajasthan's districts – Ajmer, Churu, Jhunjhunu, Nagaur, and Bikaner.

Cases supported



Childline (24*7 child helpline 1098)

The Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal (RMKM) and Childline Collaboration had a prolific year, addressing child rights through **48 weekly** meetings. They tackled issues like child marriage, labor, and abuse, using innovative tools like puppet shows and workshops. They received **830 calls**, highlighting significant community engagement and the impact of their efforts.

STORIES OF CHANGE

12-YEAR-OLD PRIYA

Received Justice



Priya (name changed), a 12-year-old girl studying in the 8th grade, comes from a family of six members. She had been troubled for quite some time due to her father's alcohol-fueled nightly altercations with the family. Following these fights, he would force other family members out of the house, leaving Priya alone with him in a locked room where he would engage in inappropriate activities. Terrified and threatened not to disclose these incidents, Priya finally opened up during counseling sessions.

Revelation and Reporting:

During counseling, Priya disclosed that her father had been sexually abusing her for an extended period and expressed fear as he mentioned similar intentions towards her younger sister. With an illiterate mother and an unsupportive grandmother at home, Priya decided to confide in her elder sister, who lived nearby. The sister then assisted Priya in reporting the matter to the Childline helpline (1098).

Intervention by Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal team:

Upon receiving the information from Priya, the Childline team informed Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal, who initiated intervention on May 18, 2022. Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal works for Access to Justice for Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation in Ajmer to ensure every child is safe and has access to their rights. They visited Priya's home, contacted her mother, and provided counseling. Priya's mother, unsure of the next steps, was guided to report the case at the local police station (FIR number 205/2022, Madanganj Police Station). Simultaneously, the team facilitated Priya's medical examination.

Legal Proceedings:

The accused was arrested during the interrogation at the police station, and two members of the Childline team provided testimony in court. However, pressure from Priya's grandmother led to a change in the grandmother's statement, and the accused was released on bail. Subsequently, the abuser resumed tormenting Priya.

Further Support and Legal Action:

Facing renewed distress, Priya sought refuge at her aunt's home, disrupting her education. The Childline team maintained contact with the family, assisting them in filing for compensation through the District Legal Services Authority in Ajmer. Priya was granted an interim relief of ₹1,25,000 and a final compensation of ₹5,00,000.

Court Verdict:

Despite Priya changing her statement, the court looked at the evidence and found her father guilty. Her father's 20-year sentence and hefty fine were a resounding victory, not just for Priya, but for every child silenced by fear. Priya, now living with her aunt, found solace in the familiar embrace of normalcy. School became a refuge, learning a balm to her wounds.

- On 2nd May 2022, during the Bhagwan Parshuram Samman Samiti event at Jawahar Rang Manch Ajmer, Shri Rakesh Kumar Kaushik, Director of RMKM Chachiyawas, was honored for his contributions by various distinguished figures, including former Rajasthan ministers.
- From 24th to 26th May 2022, students from Sagar College, Chachiyawas, visited the Blind People's Association in India as part of an exposure visit to learn about different aspects of special education and accessibility.
- From 14th to 19th June 2022, three athletes with disabilities from Minu School and CBR Ajmer participated in the National Selection Camp for Football organized by Special Olympics India in Gujarat, showcasing their talent and determination.
- On 15th July 2022, Childline Ajmer celebrated its 11th Foundation Day at Panchsheel with children from the Minu Early Intervention Center, featuring various activities and attended by law enforcement officers and RMKM officials, promoting child protection and welfare.





- On 7th July 2023, Minu School Ajmer celebrated its Foundation Day with esteemed guests, including the renowned bhajan singer Lata Tayal, and children with special needs performing a tableau depicting Lord Krishna and Radha, creating a vibrant and inclusive atmosphere.
- On 18th July 2022, RMKM Chachiyawas celebrated its 47th Foundation Day with a grand event featuring cake-cutting and cultural performances by children with disabilities, with prominent guests from the Maheshwari community and local governance, emphasizing the organization's long-standing commitment to social welfare.
- On 24th August 2022, Rmkm Chachiyawas and the Ajmer District Police inaugurated child-friendly rooms in the Christian Ganj and Ramganj police stations, providing a safe and non-threatening environment for children in police custody. The event included cultural performances and a tree-planting ceremony, fostering community support for child protection.
- On 13 September 2022, Ummeed Pushkar- 'The Ray of Hope Pushkar' celebrated its 10th Foundation Day with fun and frivolous.
- On 29th September 2022 Rmkm Chachiyawas CBR Team Ajmer organized UDAY (Inclusive Disabled People Group- IDPG) meeting at Tilora, Pushkar.

- AMRIT, a capacity-building training held at Vishwa Yuvak Kendra, New Delhi, from 30th December 2022 to 2nd January 2023, gathered 80 RMKM Chachiyawas staff for motivational sessions, cultural programs, and team-building activities, inspiring them for the upcoming year.
- KilBil was organised in Beawar and Ajmer in January and February.
- On 25th March 2023, Adwait - Center for Excellence in Education & Therapy (a unit of RMKM Chachiyawas) organized a Free Mega Camp for Children with Special Needs, offering therapeutic counseling in various fields, with chief guests Mr. Nitin Jain and Mr. Mahendra Pratap Singh.

VOLUNTEERING

In 2022-23, Rajasthan Mahila Kalyan Mandal (RMKM) experienced a dynamic year with around 80 volunteers from various colleges and schools actively participating in diverse initiatives. Volunteers from Narsee Monjee Institute of Management Studies (NMIMS), Mumbai; Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati University, Ajmer; Adesh College, Bhatinda; Eugens-Gymnasium, Stuttgart, Germany; Central University of Rajasthan, Ajmer; Mayo College, Ajmer, and more engaged in educational programs, skill development workshops, and health awareness campaigns, significantly contributing to RMKM's mission of empowering women and children.

A highlight was the involvement of international volunteers at the Ummeed Centre in Pushkar, who brought unique perspectives and expertise. They collaborated with local communities, enhancing efforts in special education, vocational training, and community outreach. 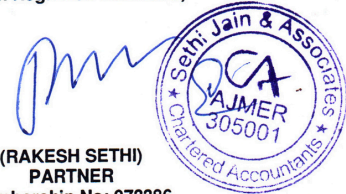

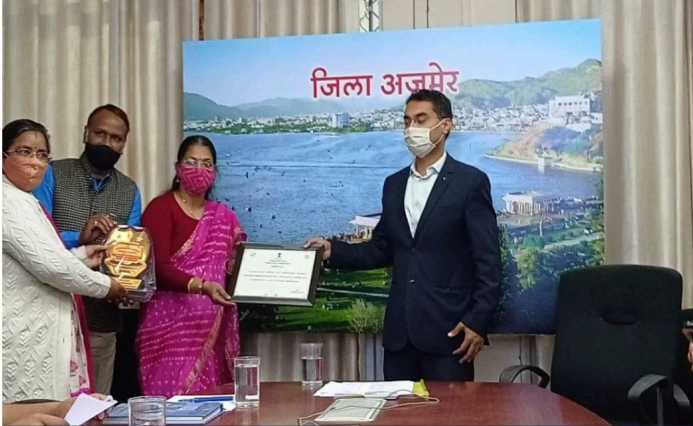

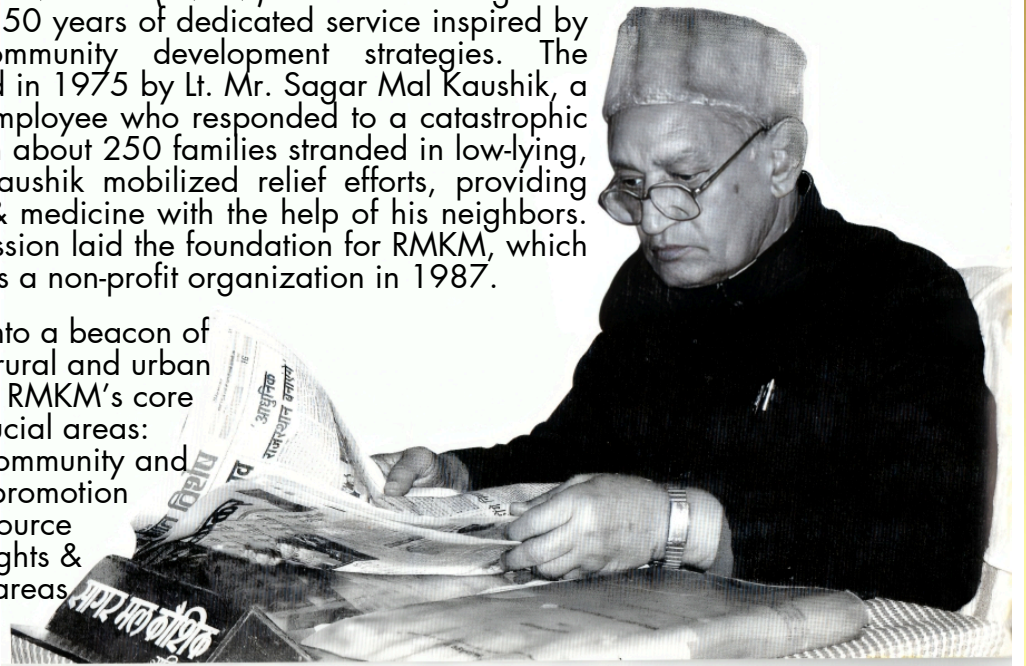
RAJASTHAN MAHILA KALYAN MANDAL 50 GOLDEN JUBILEE YEARS
